


The success of the program is largely due to great Army JROTC Instructors in your high school classroom.

- JROTC Instructors are retired three years or less from the Army in grades E-6 (Staff Sergeant) through O-6 (Colonel) and have excellent records of military performance.
- Bachelor's degree for Senior Army Instructor (SAI)
- Associate's degree for Army Instructor (AI)
- Completion of JROTC Resident Instructor Training
- Completion of JROTC Basic and Advanced Distance Learning

JROTC Instructors complete a Child Care National Agency Check and Inquiries (CNACI) background investigation.

The Army JROTC Program emphasizes character education, student achievement, wellness, leadership and diversity. It is a cooperative effort on the part of the military services and host institutions to produce successful students and citizens, while fostering in each school a more constructive and disciplined learning environment. JROTC is the Department of Defense's (DOD) largest youth development program in our secondary schools. The purpose as defined in Title 10 United States Code, Section 2031 is to instill in students in the United States secondary educational institution the values of citizenship, service to the United States, personal responsibility and a sense of accomplishment.
